



PROGRESS OF CLUB UPGRADES



With recent improvements for a wider, sturdier dock now complete, upgraded electrical supply to the pedestals in place (installed just in time for the fishing tournament), we are proud to offer much enhanced facilities for resident boat members.

The major set-back was the threat of Hurricane Matthew. The new dock was mostly dismantled shortly after the tournament to minimize the storm surge and all boats had to seek safe harbour in the lagoons. Efforts to re-construct as quickly as possible after the non-event of Matthew (for which we're very grateful) were a little slow in the beginning but all returned to normal by October 7th.

All projects (both never-ending and on-going) mentioned in previous Sloop News are being addressed and attended to as finances permit.

A reminder to boat members that there is a sample of a 1 kg marine fire suppressant in my office for anyone interested in acquiring such a product for their vessel. This extinguisher is available at Acvark in Montego Bay.
