We start off in February with our amazing Pineapple Cup race, covering the 811 nautical miles from Miami to the finish line in Montego Bay. The race starts in less than a month on Friday, Feb 3rd with the first boats expected to arrive Sunday evening or Monday. Hopefully that winning boat will be our very own, and very new Montego Bay Yacht Club entry of *Moementum*, Fredrik Moe's rather beautiful new 60 ft Catamaran, sailing with 5 crew from Mobay, one from Kingston and a very experienced South African captain named "Lucky". The fleet of 17 boats (and maybe more to be registered by the time the race starts) will be arriving during the week. In addition to the awards dinner, social activities are planned to welcome the 180 or more sailors with their families and friends at the club.

Following on from these Pineapple Cup happenings we will have the boats departing, with a few taking part in the inaugural Cuba Cup. That race starts from MBYC and sees the entrants racing to Havana for the first time in our club's history. This time around the Cuba Cup is likely to be small, but it is an event that we can continue to build on, making our new Western Caribbean series a great winter escape for racers from North America and beyond.



I look forward to seeing all our members get involved in these prestigious and world famous MBYC events. We will need volunteers and hosts to assist and guide our visiting boat crews, and to participate in and enjoy the social gatherings that we will be announcing shortly. 
